

CPS Marine Science Discoveries Project



Objective:

You will be investigating a contemporary research project in Marine Science. One class period will be dedicated for you to find a journal article or scientific publication that describes research that has contributed to our understanding of the ocean and/or the organisms that rely on the oceans. You may select from any discipline of Marine Science except Marine Conservation. Your job will be to summarize the project, findings and conclusions on the poster board and then present it to the class in a 5-10 minute presentation. Poster boards must be no smaller than 22" x 28" (standard size.) A digital poster board may be created using an appropriate app, however, it will need to be clear when projected to the class.

The following criteria must be included on your poster board:

1. Title for the project
 - o Original title created by you, not the name of the journal article
2. Area of Marine Science investigated
3. Names of the researchers involved
4. Question being answered/Problem being addressed
5. Background information
 - o Summarize what the class needs to know to understand the problem/question
6. Hypothesis for the research
7. Technology being used
 - o Do not list all the materials used in the research
 - o Focus on 1 technology and how it is used during the course of the investigation
8. Summary of the methods employed
 - o what did they do?
9. Results or observations made
 - o Include at least 1 visual of the results of the experiment
 - o You may use a chart, graph etc. published with the journal article, however you must cite it directly.
10. Summary of the analysis of the results and conclusions made
11. Full citation of the text on the back of the poster board

Topic Approval:

All students must have their topic and journal approved before beginning their project. In order to have your topic approved, students must complete and hand-in the project approval form attached.
